ASSOCIATIONS

 Different concepts get neurologically connected with each other and charged with positive or negative associations







MIND BUGS

- "Mind bugs" that start developing at a very early age, through
 - Life experiences
 - Exposure to direct and indirect social messages via media and news programming

FEELINGS & ATTITUDES

These implicit associations cause us to have feelings and attitudes about other people; based on characteristics such as race, ethnicity, age, and appearance





HOW WE PERCEIVE, EVALUATE, AND RELATE

- Biases and preferences applied in our interactions, based on visible and invisible cues
- Learned (absorbed) from our social/cultural environment (implicitly and explicitly)
